

## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Flood Planning and Funding Bills

**SB 396 Perry(R)** – Major flood planning bill relating to regional flood planning.

- Two parts of plan, dam repair and state flood plan implementation including advisory committee
- Changes water code to direct TWDB to develop a state flood plan every five year based on regional river basin plans

**SB 397 Perry(R)** – Omnibus Flood plan funding bill.

- Creates State Flood Plan Implementation Fund
- \$1.2 billion from rainy day fund for initial funding
- \$600 million for dam repair and maintenance by the State Soil and Water Conservation Board for dam repair and maintenance
- \$600 million for flood plan implementation by TWDB





## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Flood Planning and Funding Bills

**HB 478 Phelan(R)-** Creates Flood Infrastructure Fund for flood planning, mitigation, and infrastructure projects

- defines key terms eligible political subdivisions and flood project
- prescribes 9 revenue sources for fund
- 6 scenarios where funds can be used
- Imposes application requirements for those applying
- Sets up requirements for TWDB in approving applications and developing rules to establish and maintain the fund and the app process

**HB 1010 Paul, Dennis(R)** – Relating to sate and regional flood planning





## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Flood Planning and Funding Bills

**HB 274 Davis, Sarah(R)** – Relating to the creation of the disaster reinvestment and infrastructure planning revolving fund

**SB 695 Creighton, Brandon(R)** – Relating to state policies and programs that affect the funding of flood planning, mitigation, and infrastructure projects

**SJR 28 Perry(R)** - Provides for a constitutional amendment to create the State Flood Plan Implementation Fund by taking \$1.2M from the Rainy Day Fund and administered by TWDB and State Soil and Water Conservation Board



## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Flood Planning Studies

HB 801 Walle, Amando(D)/SB 179 Miles, Borris(D) — Relating to the establishment of a task force to conduct a comprehensive study on flood control infrastructure for Harris Co.

**SB 563 Perry, Charles(R)**- Relating to the reporting of information about the use of federal money for flood research, planning, and mitigation

HB 911 Huberty, Dan(R) – Creates Lake Houston Watershed Commission

HB 990 Gutierrrez, Roland(D)/SB 515 Rodriquez, Jose(D)- TWDB and TCEQ to study effects of construction of border wall on flood management, water quality, and environmental contamination impacts





#### Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Flood, Dam, and Disaster Alert/Preparedness

**HB 26 Metcalf, Will(R)** – creation of an alert system notifying people of dam releases

**HB 34 Reymond, Richard(D)** – TX Division of Emergency Management to develop statewide alert system

**HB 91 Martinez, Armando(D)** – Disaster identification and communication system in a state of emergency disaster

**HB 137 Hinojosa, Gina** – Dam hazard classification changes

**SB 285 Miles, Borris(D)** – Relating to information and outreach regarding hurricane preparedness and mitigations

HB 817 King, Tracy(D)/SB 655 Flores – Discharge bans for Nueces River portion of Edwards

**HB 944 Dutton** – Signage requirements for wastewater and injection well permits

HB 1267 Wray(R) /SB 530 Birdwell(R) — Raises water body pollution penalties up to \$5,000

**HB 1671 Huberty, Dan(R)** – Water quality protection of certain areas

**HB 1059 Lucio III, Eddie(D)** – TCEQ to appoint green Stormwater infrastructure and low impact development report group



## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Water Quality

HB 2003 Leach/SB 970 Creighton – Would shift approval authority of PE contracts from state Comptroller to Attorney General

**HB 2023 Metcalf/SB 942 Johnson** – Broadens provisions of Clean Water SRF eligibility and remove 20 year loan term limit.


HB 2426 Reynolds /SB 1498 Zaffirini— Increases size of on-site septic system from 5 to 10,000GPD and changes permitting requirements.

**HB 3035 Zwiener/ HB 4025 Rodriguez** – Amends TCEQ penalty assessment for compliance violators

**HB 1059 Lucio III, Eddie(D)** – TCEQ to appoint green Stormwater infrastructure and low impact development report group

## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Biosolids and Domestic Septage:

HB 3318 Burns / SB 1724 Birdwell – Creates permit requirements for domestic septage like those of Class B including permit rather than authorization and pathogen and vector reduction treatment like that of class B.

HB 3319 Burns / SB 1723 – Defines domestic septage and requires soil monitoring samples for I and application unit to be collected by inspectors for domestic septage sites and Class B sites.

HB 3930 Morrison / SB 2070 Menendez — Prohibits land application of grit and grease trap waste





## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Produced Water and Discharge Permits:

HB 2545 Guillen – Amends tax code to provide tax incentives to certain desal facilities. Facility permit holder gets credits for producing freshwater at desal facility and credits for mineral extraction.

HB 2771 Lozano / SB 1585 Hughes – Allows TCEQ to issue discharge permits for produced water under TPDES program then sends delegation of permitting back to RRC

HB 3067 Ashby – Changes tax code to incentivize desal of salty produced water and requires RRC to set adopt rules for program

**HB 3246 Darby** – Relates to treating produced water for beneficial use – reads as a chain of custody bill





## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Produced Water and Discharge Permits:

HB 3320 Zwiener – Requires O&G companies located over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone to submit to TCEQ a water pollution abatement plan for the facility

HB 3717 Dominguez / SB 1999 Hinojosa — creates a tax credit program incentivizing the treatment and ASR of produced water

**HB 4380 Herrero** – creates an environmental task force advisory committee which is tasked with reviewing the RRC's regulatory structure and rules





## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Spill Reporting and Remediation:

HB 3805 Paul / SB 2394 — Requires spills to be reported to county judge in which the spill or discharge occurred as soon as possible and no later than 24 hours. Existing spill exemptions apply

**SB 1994 Birdwell** – Requires spill to be reported to "local government officials"

HB 4116 Zwiener – Requires TCEQ establish an escrow account and program for TPDES permit holders to pay into the account in the event that the permit holder causes a discharge that damages the environment





#### Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Groundwater

HB 726 Larson, Lyle(R) – Omnibus groundwater bill that amends and repeals multiple sections of Chapter 36, Water Code relating to limiting rules at time of permit

**HB 1066 Ashby, Trent(R)** – Syncs up terms of export and operating permits

**HB 1479 King, Tracy(D)** – Transfer of irrigation rights in Edwards

HB 1594 Shine, Hugh(R) – TWDB to update groundwater availability models for Edwards and Trinity aquifers by Sept 2020





#### Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Water Planning and Water Availability Models (WAMS)

HB 723 Larson, Lyle(R)-WAM updates for Brazos, Guadalupe, Nueces, Red, Rio Grande, San Antonio, and San Jacinto river basins by Dec 2022

SB 724 Perry, Charles(R)-WAM updates for Brazos, Neches, Red, and Rio Grande river basins by Dec 2022

HB 807 Larson, Lyle(R) - Creates
Interregional Planning Council to bridge planning
across regions







## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Workforce Development:

**HB 1469** – Gives school districts and charter schools access to skills development fund for workforce training

**SB 1538** – Creates veterans career mentoring program for technical training

**SB 1539** – Requires Alamo Community College to implement pilot program

**SB 1576 Alvarado** – Creates TX industrial workforce apprenticeship grant program to address immediate workforce needs resulting from impact of Harvey and overall workforce shortages



## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Aquifer Storage and Recovery (ASR)

**HB 720 Larson(R)** – Relating to appropriations of water for use in aquifer storage and recovery projects

**HB 721 Larson(R)** – Relating to the duty of the TWDB to conduct studies of and submit reports on aquifer storage and recovery (ASR)

HB 481 Kuempel(R)/B 520, Donna(R) – Relating to the storage and recovery of water in a portion of the Edwards Aquifer

**HB 1052 Larson, Lyle(R)** – Allows TWDB State Participation account to be used to fund ASR or desalination facilities

**HB 1044 Zwiener, Erin (D)/SB 483 Campbell, Donna (R)** – Expands types of injection well permits for ASR projects over sections of the Edwards Aquifer – Buda bill





#### Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Lead Testing and Utility Rates

**HB 997 Collier(D)** – Mandatory lead testing by all school districts and charter schools

**HB 458 Paul(R)**— Water utilities must notify cities prior to disconnecting multifamily buildings

HB 1506 Perez – Expands eligibility for Customer assistance programs

**HB 1587 Geren/SB 700 Nichols** – Modifies investor owned utility classes and rate process





#### Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Cyber Security and Public Information/Notification

**HB 351 Blanco(D)** – adds cyber attack prevention to the emergency management purposes in the Government Code and to the definition of a "disaster"

**SB 64 Nelson(R)** – promotes information sharing on cybersecurity across jurisdictions and for electric utilities





## Welcome to the 86<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature: Bill Tracking Buffet

HB 245 Farrar – relating to requirements to make environmental and water use-permits available online

HB 4067 Murr – Work group to study issues impeding the removal of wet debris after a storm

**HB 4385 Oliverson** – Posting of info on municipal utility districts websites

HB 2527 Leach / SB 1732 Paxton — Requires water districts make audio and video recordings of open meetings available on the internet


**HB 1229 Shaheen(R)** – Allows internet postings in place of newspaper notices
