Business Meeting:

- President Kucera opened the meeting, welcomed guests and thanked the sponsors.
- President Kucera ended his term as President and passed over the leadership role to Vice President Alanis.
- Secretary Patel was then moved into the Vice President Role.
- Past President Kucera nominated Bill Gase with the City of Garland for the Secretary position.
 The nomination was approved and seconded. Bill Gase was elected by a voice vote by all of the members in attendance.
- President Alanis, requested approval of November 2017 Meeting Minutes, and then requested introductions from all the attendees.



Peggy Glass:

Reported that a meeting has been scheduled with L'Oreal Stepney at TCEQ on February 12 to present recommended revisions to the water quality standards and Implementation Procedures provisions related to dissolved salts (total dissolved solids, chloride, and sulfate). The recommendations for standards will be developed for inclusion in the next triennial revision, not the 2018 revision. The committee representing the TDS Coalition is recommending the following:

Standards:

- No standards for unclassified waters-quality is controlled by compliance with standards for first downstream classified water.
- Chloride and sulfate standards based on lowa approach (studies of ion toxicity to aquatic life) except where naturally occurring salt concentrations are higher.
- No TDS standards except to protect water supply and agricultural uses.
- No conductivity standards.
- Exemptions during drought.

Implementation Procedures:

- Screen for need for permit limits based on median flow instead of harmonic mean flow.
- Exempt domestic dischargers from potential limits if the increase in TDS in the effluent compared to the TDS in the water supply does not exceed 400 mg/L.
- Exempt discharger from permit limits if discharge is passing Whole Effluent Toxicity testing.
- o Provide exemption based on net environmental benefit.
- Provide for the establishment of a temporary standard for periods up to 20 years, with revalidation in 5-year increments.
- Consider managing dissolved salts through a Pollutant Management Plan rather than numeric limits.
